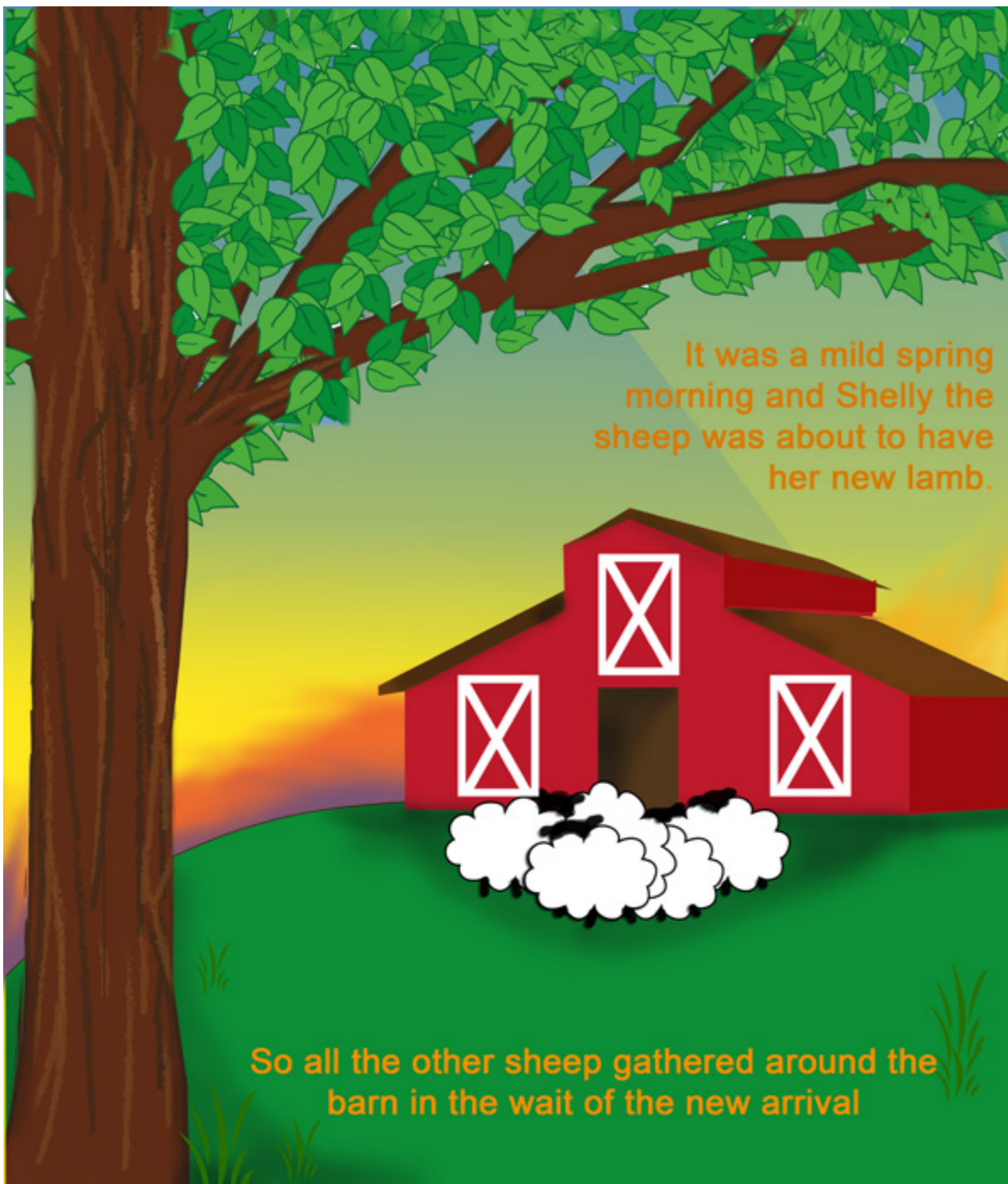


It's okay to be different

'They're not orange, mine is orange and his is red, you're so silly'




Lambys ears sank with sadness and he felt different and silly for he could not see that the lambs were wearing different onesies.
